



JANUARY

-Garnet-




January. Garnet is a silicate mineral, found in a range of colors, but as a gemstone its deep red has symbolized peace, prosperity and good health.

February. Amethyst is the purple form of quartz (SiO₂). This gemstone is often associated with qualities of peace, courage and stability.




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MARCH

-Aquamarine-



-Diamond-





April. Diamond, the hardest gemstone, is made of just one element: carbon. Its structure makes it 58 times harder than anything in nature and it can only be cut with another diamond.




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MAY

-Emerald-





May. The emerald, a dazzling green form of the mineral beryl [$\text{Be}_3\text{Al}_2(\text{Si}_6\text{O}_{18})$], has traditionally been a symbol of rebirth, granting the owner foresight, good fortune, and youth.

-Pearl-





June. Pearls are the only birthstone organically formed. They have been used as adornment for centuries, representing tears of gods and mythical creatures and symbolizing wealth, status, and sometimes wisdom.

July. Ruby is the red form of the mineral corundum (Al_2O_3). It has traditionally symbolized passion, protection, and prosperity,

-Peridot-





August. Peridot (Mg_2SiO_4) is often formed in volcanic regions. This bright green gemstone has traditionally been associated with the ability to harness the power of nature.



SEPTEMBER

September. Sapphire typically refers to the rich blue gemstone variety of the mineral corundum (Al_2O_3). Its celestial color has been associated with heaven and has sometimes been thought to attract divine favor and wise judgment.



OCTOBER

-Opal-




October. The name "opal" originates from the Greek word opallios, which means "to see a change in color," and is therefore associated with the sky and with rainbows, bringing good luck to the wearer.



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NOVEMBER

-TOPAZ-



November. Topaz $[Al_2(SiO_4)(F,OH)_2]$ is one of two yellow-hued gemstones associated with this month; the other is a form of quartz, citrine. Considered sacred in many cultures, topaz has been associated with protection and healing.



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DECEMBER

-Turquoise-



December. Admired since ancient times, the mineral turquoise $[\text{Cu}(\text{Al}, \text{Fe}^{3+})_6(\text{PO}_4)_4(\text{OH})_8 \cdot 4\text{H}_2\text{O}]$ is known for its distinct color, ranging from powdery to greenish robin's egg blue. Its associations vary from spiritual power to earthly protection.
